ACT 2025 Community Meeting

- PC Chairs: Amar and JS
- PC:
 - o 39 members
 - o 51 invited/12 declined
 - 20 were first time ACT PC members
 - 2 members from ACT2024 PC was on ACT2025 PC
 - No grad students (complaint)
- CFP:
 - o PC members could bid on submissions b/w Feb 26 and March 3
 - Was able to use EasyChair (James Fairbanks footed bill)
 - Not cheap and getting more expensive per year
 - Proceedings in EPTCS
 - No extensions were given or required (no one requested)
 - Paper submissions, extensions were allowed for 2 3
 - No rebuttal stage
 - James Fairbanks & JS Lemay: Pro-rebuttal; doesn't really change minds
- Submission Data:
 - ACT2023: 80 submissions
 - o ACT2024: 70 submissions
 - ACT2025: 50 submissions
 - JS Lemay: Looks grim
 - JS Lemay: Going more mathy and less computer sciencey
 - Only about 1 Al submission
 - 32 Accepted
 - 7 Proceeding Papers (17 submissions)
 - 25 Talks (33)
 - Political situation in US; drop expected
 - JS Lemay: Going from ~70 -> 50 submissions was shocking
 - JS Lemay: Talinn will be big test
- Schedule:
 - Everyone got 30 minute talks
 - Single track
 - No need for parallel sessions
 - More breaks led to more networking
 - James Fairbanks: REALLY great win, still packed room despite only one track
- Invited Speakers:
 - Previous ACT used best submissions
 - This year wanted to find invited speakers:
 - Some bad luck
 - People for PC and invited speakers said no due to political situation

- Two invited speakers had to decline due to serious issues (death of loved ones and medical emergencies)
- Basically went back to best submissions
- Adjoint School Report (Innocent Obi Jr):
 - Had folks from across globe
 - Had a nice little group house this year
 - 6 students couldn't attend in person
 - Political situation
 - Visa problems
 - Mentoring within Adjoint School
 - James Fairbanks: Was declined due to repeating topics; should be more flexible with repeating topics (if we are not turning down mentors)
 - Dorette Pronk: Try to get as many people as involved as possible; more from across globe
 - Thinking about virtual/in-person
 - Automated Reasoning Group at AWS helped with funding/sponsoring

 - Innocent Obi Jr: Every year 2 new people join organizers, 2 people roll off
 - Dorette Pronk: Could move to Canada
 - CBW: Where to have dedicated platform? Zulip probably isn't the best. Could roll-over year to year.
 - Emilio Minichiello: We had Discord last year
 - John Morris: Make a dedicated channel in Zulip for ACT2025
 - James Fairbanks: Make a Zulip for the registrants who are attending
 - Dorette Pronk: I find it very useful
 - JS Lemay: What do we think about the trend in submissions?
 - Gioelle Zardini: Can we do data analysis on submissions?
 - Wondering who is not applying
 - James Fairbanks: Could use EasyChair for seeing who is submitting.
 - JS Lemay: Other ACT-friendly conferences are seemingly struggling more than others
 - SIAG Material Science
 - Rob Cornish: How is CT doing?
 - JS Lemay: CT IS BOOMING! They are doing ~7 minutes; actually having to decline people
 - Dorette Pronk: Speed talks are in-place of conference sessions
 - James Fairbanks: Has combining CT and ACT together (or co-locating) been considered?

- James Fairbanks: ACT has been roughly going back and forth
- Gioelle Zardini: Interesting shift to less proceedings submissions
 - Gioelle Zardini: Form question: "Why didn't you submit to the proceedings?"
 - John Williams: Many proceedings submissions from last year
- Sebastien:
 - JS Lemay: Software demos aren't proceedings papers
 - James Fairbanks: Asks for submissions and accept rate; EPTCS won't accept, right?
 - Forecasting to 4 is not great
- Rob Cornish: What has been the trend in general? How far back in time do we have?
 - JS Lemay: Lowest number of proceedings since ACT started
- John Morris: Could we have industry tracks?
 - Gioelle Zardini: ACT folks in industry but unfriendly industries
 - Dorette Pronk: "Oh, not interested in applications" and "not going to like my talk"
- JS Lemay: Thoughts about PC make-up, etc.?
 - Evan Patterson: What is the justification for churn?
 - JS Lemay: Same group of people who were always more or less affiliated together
 - You want to grow the people and community
 - Somewhat cliqueish beforehand
 - No complaints about PC reviews
 - Dorette Pronk: I liked the review process
 - Prior years, people half-assed it
 - For new folks, there was a sense of engagement
 - Gioelle Zardini: Not sustainable but can help with churn
 - James Fairbanks: Spreadsheet is very helpful
- o Is 3 months typical between call and deadline?
 - Gabriel Goren-Roig: Last year was end of year
- Gabriel Goren-Roig: Fact that I am here from South meets I am missing during semester
 - JS Lemay: Europeans won't attend in August
- Rob Cornish: Is there less of an industry presence this year compared? What's the story?
 - JS Lemay: Last year, Mike had connections
- John Morris: I really enjoyed ACT2025 this year; people were nice, welcoming and tolerant of my lack of knowledge
- Sebastien: Having a primarily in person conference was great for networking and community building
- Sebastien: Could we have a Zoom, could we have zoom in place of videos?
 - Because of timezones
- Dorette Pronk: Why ws it impossible to record meetings for ACT2025 this year?

- A: Because of the AV equipment in the venue and the cost of recording with rented equipment.
- Generally the community would prefer a limited-access in-person conference or primarily-remote conference?
 - Gioelle Zardini: I committed on Zulip to having Zoom support on MIT 2027
 - Afraid of not having many folks not showing up
 - JS Lemay: I support hybrid and remote conferences, but things cost money if folks don't show up
 - Gioelle Zardini: I would like to have recordings
 - JS Lemay: Online CT conference called Octoberfest
 - Dorette Pronk: Someone would need to step-up for ACT
- What will be done to ensure future conferences are held in safer, more accessible
- Laura Scull: Has anyone's institution not funded you if you could have zoomed?
 - JS Lemay: Yes, it is nice to be live so you could ask questions live
- Sebastien: Having the videos or slides would be the same as having an online component?
 - JS Lemay: No, it would not be the same
 - JS Lemay: Having slides and recordings is not a decision of the organizers but of the speaker
 - James Fairbanks: JS did ask for slides,
- Dorette Pronk: We should try to have an online ACT and see how it goes
